Freshman Scholarships

Early admission to IUPUI is the best way to ensure scholarship consideration. Students meeting criteria will be sent notification for the highest admission-based scholarship for which they are eligible as part of their admission notification package. A scholarship application for competitive scholarships is available online. Check the Scholarships Web site frequently for updates, applications, deadlines, and criteria.

IMPORTANT NOTES ON QUALIFICATIONS :

1. To be eligible for consideration, student must have applied with all required materials by deadline in parentheses. Student must be considered fully qualified by the Office of Admissions and have no more than one grade below C in college preparatory courses.
2. SAT total refers to Critical Reading and Math score total. ACT score refers to composite score.
3. Unless noted, scholarships are for first-semester freshmen who are enrolling for the fall as full-time students.
4. GPA is based on a 4.0 scale.

Admission-Based Scholarships (no separate application is required)

Valedictorian and Salutatorian Scholarships (February 1) - \$5,000 renewable. Freshmen applicants ranked first or second in their high school class with a 1200 SAT or 26 ACT score may qualify for this scholarship. Students with this rank who have a lower SAT/ACT score may be considered if they are receiving the Indiana Academic Honors Diploma.

IUPUI Academic Excellence Scholarships (February 1) - \$2,500 renewable. Freshmen applicants who have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.75 or higher with a 1200 SAT or 26 ACT score may be eligible for this scholarship.

IUPUI Dean of the Faculties Scholarships (February 1) - \$2,000 renewable. Freshmen applicants who have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.50 or higher with a 1100 SAT or 24 ACT score may be eligible for this scholarship.

First Generation Scholarships (February 1) - \$1,500 renewable. This scholarship is for freshmen applicants who will be the first in their family (mother, father, siblings) to graduate from an accredited college (bachelor's degree). Freshmen applicants who have a cumulative high school GPA of 3.0 or higher with a 1000 SAT or

21 ACT score may be eligible for this scholarship. A lower SAT/ACT score may be considered if the student is on track to receive the Indiana Academic Honors Diploma and is taking a strong senior year curriculum.

IUPUI Outstanding GED Scholarships (April 1) - \$1,500 renewable. Students with an average score of 65 (650) or higher on the GED Test and who are admitted to IUPUI are eligible to receive this scholarship.

Bepko Scholars and Fellows Program (Scholarship application and freshman admission application must be filed by December 1) - In-state undergraduate tuition, fees, and books for four years of study, 2 years of on-campus housing, and up to \$5,000 per year for four years of graduate or professional study at IUPUI.

This highly competitive program provides financial, academic, and programming support to academically motivated and civically engaged students throughout their undergraduate and post-graduate years. Criteria: excellent SAT or ACT scores, outstanding performance in a rigorous college-preparatory curriculum, and extensive civic engagement endeavors are required. Indiana University Hoosier Presidential Scholars Program (Scholarship application and freshman admission application must be filed by December 1) - \$9,000 renewable.

This scholarship offers 10 of Indiana's top high school graduates four-year renewable scholarships to attend IUPUI. Eligible applicants should have a minimum SAT of 1250 or ACT of 27, be ranked in the top 10 percent of their high school class, and/or have a high school GPA of 3.85 or higher. Emphasis is also placed on well-rounded students, excelling not only in academics but also in extracurricular activities, leadership abilities, and community service. The scholarship includes a personal laptop computer and funding to be used for study abroad in the junior or senior year. Recipients must be Indiana residents. Plater Distinguished Scholars Program (Scholarship application and freshman admission application must be filed by December 1) - As a key component to the Plater International Scholars Program this highly competitive scholarship program is available to

In addition to the yearly amount provided toward tuition, the scholarship also provides funding for a study abroad experience as well as a partial housing stipend for one year for living in International House. IUPUI Honors Program Scholarships (February 1) - \$1,500 renewable. Freshmen who graduate in the top 15% of their graduating class, present excellent grades in challenging academic coursework, and have an SAT score of at least 1200 or an ACT score of 26 are eligible to apply. Norman Brown Diversity & Leadership Program (March 1, including scholarship application) - Up to \$3000 renewable. For freshmen and transfer students. Students from racial and ethnic populations who have been historically underserved in institutions of higher education in Indiana are encouraged to apply. Admitted freshmen and transfer students should consult the Web page for additional eligibility criteria and application information. Students with financial need may be eligible for additional funding when available.

Diversity Scholars Research Program (March 1, including scholarship application) - Full tuition and fees-renewable. The program seeks academically talented students who will contribute to the diversity of IUPUI. The research component introduces students to a research setting plus preparation for graduate studies. This award is made to students in a variety of majors at IUPUI and is highly competitive. Nina Mason Pulliam Scholars Program (April 1, including scholarship application) - Full In-state tuition, fees, books, and living allowance. This scholarship honors Nina Mason Pulliam, a journalist, business leader, and humanitarian. Consult the Web page for criteria. Sam H. Jones Community Service Scholarship Program Freshman Service Scholarships (February 1, priority date including scholarship application) - \$2,500. Transfer Scholarships

Thomas C. Cooke and Carol D. Nathan Passport-Academic Excellence Scholarships - \$1000 per semester renewable. Scholarship is for students transferring from Ivy Tech State College, Indianapolis. Students must have a 3.3 GPA and complete an associate degree. Consult the Web page for eligibility criteria, including additional deadlines and application information.

Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Scholarships - \$750 per semester renewable. Scholarship is available to PTK members who have completed an associate's degree at any two-year college or Ivy Tech Community College. Consult the Web page for eligibility criteria, including deadlines and application information.

IUPUI Outstanding Transfer Student Scholarship - \$1,000 in-state/\$2,500 out-of-state renewable. Eligible applicants must have a minimum 3.3 GPA with at least 12 transferable credit hours, but no more than 60. Consult the Web page for deadlines and application information.

J.A. Abell Scholarship - Up to \$1,000 This scholarship is available to transfer students with a minimum 3.5 GPA and financial need. FAFSA required. Consult the Web page for eligibility criteria, including deadlines and application information.

Steps for Applying for Financial Aid

- File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the renewal FAFSA by the priority deadline of March 1, 2008, or as soon as possible after that date. List Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis (code 001813) in the section of the form where you list the schools you may attend. Filing before March 1 assures consideration for University and state aid. Filing after March 1 allows only consideration for federal aid.* Note that students applying for Spring or Summer 2008 sessions must file both a 2007-2008 and 2008-2009 FAFSA.
- The 2008-2009 FAFSA may be completed as early as January 1, 2008. The form is available at high schools and colleges and online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. If you are considering more than one IU campus, list each of the campuses on the FAFSA.
- After you complete the paper FAFSA, you must mail the form to the address on the form or file it electronically through the Internet at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Electronic filing is the preferred method.
- If you file electronically, you will receive an electronic copy of your Student Aid Report (SAR) within a few business days. If you file by mail you will receive a SAR approximately four weeks after mailing. Be sure IUPUI is listed.
- If you are required to submit a tax return or other documents for financial aid verification, the Office of Student Financial Aid Services will notify you.
- After your financial aid awards have been made, Student Financial Aid Services will send you an award notification to the address on file with IUPUI.

Estimated Tuition and Fee Information

Tuition at IUPUI is calculated by credit hours of classes. In addition to credit hour-based tuition, some courses have special fees such as supplies, equipment, or laboratory fees. In addition students are charged technology, student activity, and athletic development fees. At the time of printing, we did not have the final fees for 2007-2008. Consult the Office of the Bursar Web page, bursar.iupui.edu, for exact costs.

A three-payment plan, called a personal deferment, is available. Students who are receiving any type of financial assistance may consult with our Office of Financial Aid Services about payment.

The following are estimated costs for two semesters. In addition to these costs, you will need to budget for your personal expenses; commuting and transportation cost, and room and board, whether you live on campus, at home, or in an apartment. This assumes you carry 15 credit hours each semester.

* In addition to the student activity fee and technology fee included here, some courses require lab or course material fees. The current schedule of classes will note all fees.

Housing Costs

The Campus Apartments on the River Walk offer one-, two-, and four-bedroom furnished apartments with full kitchens and laundry facilities. Freshmen are encouraged to reside in Ball Hall's "Living Your Freshman Experience" (LYFE) Residential-Based Learning Community. Residence Hall rates range from \$2500 to \$3400 per year, depending on room size. Campus Apartments on the River Walk rates range from \$625 to \$850 per month depending on one, two or four bedrooms. Additional Residential-Based Learning Communities located at the Campus Apartments on the River Walk include the Women in Science House, Purdue House, Herron House, International House, Honors House, and Graduate/Professional House. Consult the Web page listed below for details on housing communities and rates. Housing assignments are done on a first-come, first-served basis. Therefore, early application is encouraged.
