IUPUI CONTINUING STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

IUPUI administers over \$200 million in financial aid and scholarships every year to thousands of IUPUI students to aid them in paying for their education. Scholarships, awarded to students through many different programs at IUPUI, are usually awarded based on academic performance and potential for future performance. Some programs also look at leadership, extracurricular involvement and community service. Some also require financial need. See Scholarship Central at www.iupui.edu/~scentral/ for more information on other IUPUI scholarships not listed here.

One Application, One Transcript!

With this application, you may apply for multiple scholarships at the same time and need to submit only one copy of your most recent IUPUI transcript (downloadable from *OneStart*) or, if you are a transfer student, you must provide a transcript from the previous institution where you were registered. In some cases, you can even submit one essay for more than one scholarship. Recommendation forms/letters can also be used for multiple scholarships.

Recommendation forms: Forms must be completed by a faculty member, academic counselor, clergy member or employer, those who can attest to your character and academic performance. **Recommenders cannot be family members.** If preferred, a recommendation letter can be submitted. These should be on letterhead and sealed with the recommendation form, then sent to our office. **Note:** Be sure recommendations speak to the type of scholarship for which you are applying.

Deadlines: *Deadlines for each scholarship vary.*
NOTE: Deadlines mean the date the scholarship application and materials must be received in our office, NOT POSTMARKED BY THAT DATE.

Transfer Students: Scholarships listed in this application in red are available to transfer students. Most of these scholarships are for students who have NOT yet attended IUPUI and plan to do so in the upcoming academic year. If you are a current IUPUI student who previously transferred, you are not eligible for transfer scholarships unless they are also available to continuing IUPUI students. Please thoroughly read the description under the scholarships identified as transfer scholarships for more detailed information and criteria.

Essays: It goes without saying that essays should observe the general rules of English. It is also recommended that you put your name on each page

of the essay. Cover pages, plastic report covers, etc., are not necessary and will be removed when we process them. Because faculty read the essays to understand you better and gauge your abilities, essays

are like interviews, so dress accordingly! Originality is encouraged, but observance of grammar rules is even more important.

Scholarships and Tuition at IUPUI

Most scholarships at IUPUI are credited to the student account, usually with the award amount being split between Fall and Spring semesters. They are applied against the balance on the student account after registration and any remaining balance is sent to the student for use for other educational expenses like books, etc.

Below are the descriptions of the scholarships for which you may apply with this application. Be sure to check the Scholarship Central Website for other scholarships at IUPUI and where you can obtain those applications.

Please note the deadlines vary. Deadlines indicate when application materials must be received, NOT postmarked. Applications can be dropped off at the Scholarship Office or drop box (CA 103). You may fax this document to 317-278-3292; please call to verify it was received.

Multiple Scholarships: Some combinations of scholarship awards may be possible. IUPUI Enrollment Services tends to limit scholarships and awards to not exceed full-time tuition, fees and books. Some students, however, may receive additional awards from their IUPUI academic units (i.e. School of Science, Liberal Arts, Herron, etc.).

To be eligible for scholarship consideration, you must be fully registered for classes for the upcoming Fall semester by June 1st.

Motivated adult (30+) students returning to school after a minimum of 5 years, with at least 12 credit hours completed at IUPUI and a 3.3 GPA in all courses since returning who are working toward their first baccalaureate degree.

DJ Angus-Sciencetech Education Foundation Scholarship

Deadline: March 15th

The DJ Angus-Sciencetech Education Foundation Scholarship in the School of Science recognizes science students attending IUPUI who excel academically, show promise of success in their future careers and require financial assistance to attend college. The DJ Angus-Sciencetech Education Foundation Scholarship recipient will receive a scholarship payable in two installments, one installment per semester. Applicants must 1) be School of Science majors on the IUPUI campus, 2) be graduates of a high school which is located in Boone, Hamilton, Hancock, Hendricks, Johnson, Madison, Marion, Morgan or Shelby county, 3) be working toward completion of a first baccalaureate degree, 4) have completed at least 25 credit hours of course work at IUPUI by the time of application, 5) have an overall minimum grade point average of 2.80 by the time of application, and 6) qualify for financial aid. McCracken Assist Scholarship

Single, custodial parents at IUPUI pursuing their first undergraduate degree may apply if they have: completed at least 9 credit hours at IUPUI with a minimum 2.75 GPA within the last year. This scholarship is financial need-based, although academic progress/potential are also considered.

Essay Question: As a single parent, what has been the most challenging experience or issue while pursuing your college education and how have you managed to get through it?

Jonathan A. Carter Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is designated for part-time returning and/or non-traditional male students who may not otherwise qualify for financial assistance. Students must exhibit qualities of caring for others, desire to succeed and a strong work ethic. Preference will be given to a student majoring in business. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.

Robert E. Cavanaugh Scholarship

Currently enrolled upper-class students of all majors who have graduated from an Indiana High School, who demonstrate leadership abilities and have some demonstrated financial-need are encouraged to apply. Must have at least 26 credits completed at IUPUI and a 3.0 cumulative GPA.

Essay question: In using your leadership abilities, how would you justify the importance and value of a college education to current high school students?

Commitment to Engineering Excellence Scholarship

\$2,200 per academic year

Deadline: February 1st

This scholarship from the School of Engineering and Technology is for underrepresented students, specifically women and minority students whose presence will enhance the learning environment through increased diversity at IUPUI. Students must either be currently enrolled as Engineering and Technology students and/or be directly admitted to the School of Engineering and Technology (for transfer students). Preference will be given to students with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher. Students must complete the IUPUI scholarship application and an interview. This scholarship is renewable as long as full-time enrollment and a cumulative GPA of 3.2 is maintained. Students will also have opportunities for paid undergraduate research.

This is not automatically renewable for continuing students.

Dean of Science Scholarship

A, E, T, R2

Up to \$2,000

Deadline: March 15th

The Dean of Science Scholars Program is designed for students majoring in the School of Science. These competitive scholarships provide awards of up to \$2,000 per academic year. Continuing science majors with a minimum of 25 credit hours completed at IUPUI by the end of the Spring semester during which application is being made and at least a 3.5 GPA may apply for this competitive scholarship.

Contingent upon availability of funds, a Dean of Science Scholar may be supported for additional years provided that the student has eligible unspent funds, continues in a degree program in the School of Science, and maintains an overall GPA of at least 3.5. An award recipient may hold only one scholarship funded by the School of Science.

Application, resume, essay and two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a full-time faculty member, must be received by March 15th. Contact Joseph Thompson at jlthomp@iupui.edu for additional information.

The Indiana Geology & Gem Society Scholarship is available to a sophomore-level geology major who has an overall minimum 3.25 GPA, has completed the introductory physical and historical geology courses with an average GPA of at least 3.7 (A-), and must be enrolled in at least 9 credit hours in the Fall semester the award begins, including mineralogy or a higher-level geology course. Students must submit the Continuing Student Scholarship Application, essay, transcript, and letter of recommendation. Health and Life Science Scholarship

The Health & Life Science Scholars Program is designed for students majoring in the health and life sciences. These competitive scholarships provide awards of up to \$2,000 per academic year. Continuing health and life science majors with a minimum of 25 credit hours completed at IUPUI by the end of the spring semester during which application is being made and at least a 3.5 GPA may apply for this competitive scholarship.

Contingent upon availability of funds, a Health and Life Science Scholar may be supported for additional years provided that the student has eligible unspent funds, continues in a degree program in a health or life science field, and maintains an overall GPA of at least 3.5.

An award recipient may hold only one scholarship funded by the School of Science. Application, resume, essay and two letters of recommendation, one of which must be from a full-time faculty member, must be received by March 15th. Zora Neale Hurston-Mari Evans Scholarship

Up to \$1,000, renewable for an additional year

Deadline: February 1st

Created in honor of Zora Neale Hurston and Mari Evans, this scholarship seeks to encourage the study of subjects that transcend gender, race, age, culture and economic status and are designed to support students whose creativity, academic achievements and goals reflect the issues articulated in the works of these two prominent American literary figures. Students seeking a baccalaureate degree in the creative arts, including composing and music performance, liberal arts and social sciences are encouraged to apply. Recipients participate in educational activities each semester. Up to ten \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to continuing IUPUI students.

Two scholarships may be renewed for an additional year with maintenance of a 3.0 GPA, full-time enrollment, and selection to serve as an upper-class mentor. The final round of applicants will be invited to interview with the committee.

Essay Question (500 words): Write an essay which reflects the issues articulated in the works of these two prominent American literary figures. Explain an obstacle or challenge in your life that you overcame.

Indiana Members Credit Union Scholarship

Applicants must have an overall cumulative 3.0 GPA. Preference will be given to applicants who are a current member or have a parent or guardian that is a current member of Indiana Members Credit Union. The recipients must maintain a minimum 2.5 grade point average based on a 4.0 grading scale throughout the academic year for which the Scholarship is made.

Two undergraduate students will be awarded from University College each year.

Essay Question: A credit union is a non-profit financial institution that is a great alternative to banks and traditionally has the philosophy of people helping people. Explain how you have demonstrated this same philosophy in your actions through volunteering.

Sam H. Jones Community Service Scholarship

\$3,500 **A, T, E, R2, I**

Deadline: March 1st

(Two letters of recommendation required, with one from a campus representative familiar with your service.)

The Sam H. Jones Community Service Scholarship Program recognizes IUPUI students for previous service to their campus or community, and supports their continued involvement in educationally meaningful service, leadership, and social advocacy. The program honors Sam H. Jones' legacy as a community leader whose vision and dedication improved the quality of life for many in Central Indiana. Community Service Scholars will volunteer 4 hours per week throughout the academic year at a selected service agency or public school. In addition, Community Service Scholars will enroll in and complete a service-learning course (PHST-P330) in the Fall, and work with others to coordinate a campus-wide service event. Applicants must have completed 15 IUPUI total credit hours/2.75 GPA by the end of the Spring semester of application and submit two letters of recommendation, with one from a campus representative who is familiar with your service activities.

Essay Question (2-3 pages): Describe the ways that you have been involved in campus or community service activities during the past two years. Discuss the positive impact your service has had on others and the significant lessons that you have learned by participating in voluntary service.

Frank G. and Ernestine M. Lambertus Scholarship

Up to \$2500 non-renewable **A, E, T, R1, F**

Deadline: January 15th

It is the intent of the Donors that the scholarship be given to an undergraduate student(s) who is pursuing a degree in the School of Science, who has demonstrated progress and significant improvement in his/her academic program, and who is a working student or who otherwise demonstrates financial need. Preference will be given to a student(s) who is from central Indiana and to a student(s) who demonstrates civic engagement. During 30 years with IUPUI, Irving J. Levy exemplified his motto of "Students Come First" and showed unwavering dedication to students, particularly adult students. Upon his retirement and in honor of Dr. Levy's dedication to students, the Irving J. Levy Scholarship was established by the Faculty Advisory Committee of the IUPUI General Studies Degree Program. This scholarship is available to an adult General Studies student who exhibits scholastic achievement and demonstrable financial aid need as defined by the FAFSA.

The scholarship is intended to cover the cost of tuition and must be used within the academic school year it is given.

Sam Masarachia Scholarship

Full Tuition (In-state rate)

Deadline: February 1st

The Masarachia Program is designed for continuing, full-time students in Liberal Arts interested in studies and careers related to active representation, advocacy and policy research involving labor, senior citizens and communities. Continuing students must have at least a 3.0 GPA and financial need. Only incoming sophomores and juniors with at least two full years to complete prior to graduation are eligible to apply. Transfer students will also be considered.

Essay Question: How do you view the conditions and interests of workers, seniors, and/or communities in today's society? How do you see yourself making a difference in the representation of these groups?

Math and Science Education Scholarship

\$2,500 per year, renewable up to 4 years

Deadline: March 1st

The Math and Science Teaching Scholarship (MSTS) Program offered by the Urban Center for the Advancement of Math/Science Education (UCASE), is designed to encourage and support outstanding students who have had a strong math or science based major and who wish to pursue a career in math or science teaching at the middle and/or high school level. Eligible students must be enrolled in a science or math based program and have completed at least 25 credits towards the degree; have a cumulative GPA of 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale); provide at least two (2) letters of recommendation, one of which should be from a faculty member from the student's major at IUPUI; and must be a citizen or permanent resident of the U.S. Eligible students from under-represented minority groups are encouraged to apply.

Essay question (500-800 words): What experience(s) has motivated you to pursue a career teaching science or mathematics?

Charles O. McGaughey Scholarship

A, E, T, R1

\$2,000

Deadline: March 15th

These leadership awards were established to recognize students who have demonstrated leadership abilities and an appreciation of basic American values through a record of achievement in community services or service to IUPUI. Juniors and Seniors with a 3.5 GPA, with a preference to students majoring in Liberal Arts, Science and Business, are encouraged to apply.

Essay Question: How might social and health issues, urban growth and changes in the environment affect us locally and nationally during this century?

Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Scholarship

A, T, E

\$1,500 annually, renewable

Deadlines: March 15th for Fall & October 15th for Spring, admission and application

This scholarship is available to PTK members who have completed an associate degree at any two-year college. To be eligible, the applicant must have completed, or be within 6 months of completing an A.A., A.S., or A.A.S. degree with at least a 3.3 cumulative GPA upon graduation. Applications will be accepted 6 months prior to graduation. A final transcript, with degree noted, must be submitted before the scholarship is awarded. The recipient must be admitted and registered for classes at IUPUI within 2 semesters after graduating from any two-year college. This scholarship can be awarded to both full-time and part-time students and must be used within three years of the initial award. The PTK scholarship will be renewable if the student maintains at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA at IUPUI.

Essay Question: What motivated you to continue your education at IUPUI?

Richard Rapala Scholarship

Deadline: March 15th

For continuing cyto-technology, clinical laboratory science, medical technology, and nursing majors (**admitted to the program**). Criteria based on academic performance and financial need (FAFSA required). No essay required.

David L. Robbins Scholarship

A, T

Up to \$500

Deadline: March 15th

The David L. Robbins Scholarship, in honor of former Vice Chancellor for Fiscal and Budgetary Affairs at IUPUI, is available to dependents of IUPUI staff or faculty. Applicants must be an upperclassman at IUPUI with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA and full-time enrollment.

Application must include verification letter from relative who works for IUPUI with contact information included.

Rotaract Altruism Scholarship in Honor of John Henry Weidner

A, E, T, R1, I

\$1,500 annually, non-renewable

Deadline: March 15th

This scholarship is awarded to an IUPUI student who exemplifies the spirit of altruism: unselfish concern for the welfare of others. It is named in honor of John Henry Weidner who displayed great altruism in assisting over 1,000 innocent people during WWII who were fleeing from Nazi persecution along the French-Dutch border. In addition to this application, candidates for the award may be asked to submit a supplemental application, and finalists will be interviewed. This scholarship is funded by the Rotary Club of Indianapolis and the recipient will be chosen by the John Weidner Scholarship Committee: a panel of Rotaract Club officers, advisers, and others designated by Rotaract.

Essay: Describe the ways you have put into practice the motto of Rotary International: "Service Above Self;" what has motivated you to show concern for the welfare of others, and how you anticipate the spirit of altruism will shape your future.

Dr. Arthur Mirsky Senior Academy Academic Scholarship

A, E, T, R2

Up to \$2,000.

Deadline: March 1st, admission and application

The Senior Academy at IUPUI has established a scholarship program designed to partially support tuition and books for students who are graduating seniors who expect to graduate with a baccalaureate degree at the end of the Spring Semester. Applications will be reviewed and the awardee selected by the Senior Academy Scholarship Awards Committee. Applicants must (1) be in good academic standing at IUPUI, (2) have successfully completed at least 90 credit hours, (3) have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.00 scale, and (4) agree to enroll during the Fall-Spring Semesters for the number of credit hours required to graduate at the end of the Spring Semester, but for no less than a total of at least 20 credit-hours during the last year. The applicant must also submit two letters of recommendation from current or former instructors, and complete an essay.

Essay Question: Write a two-page, double-spaced, typewritten essay on your academic goals, how you are achieving them, and your plans after receiving your baccalaureate degree.

Dr. Arthur Mirsky Senior Academy Returning Student Scholarship

A, E, T, R1

Up to \$2,000

Deadline: March 1st, admission and application

The Senior Academy at IUPUI has established a scholarship program designed to partially support tuition and books for students who, for some reason, dropped out of college-level status for at least 5 years, and are now planning to return to school in order to complete their first undergraduate degree. Applications will be reviewed and the awardee selected by the Senior Academy Scholarship Awards Committee.

Applicants must (1) meet regular re-admission requirements to IUPUI, (2) have had a grade point average of at least 2.00 on a 4.00 scale for the college-level courses completed before dropping out, and (3) agree to enroll for at least 6 credit hours per semester. The applicant must also

submit one letter of recommendation and complete an essay.

Essay Question: Write a two-page, double-spaced typewritten essay on your academic goals and why your experience during your absence from school will enhance the successful completion of your academic goals.

Sindoqua Scholarship for Native Americans

A, T

Up to \$1,000

Deadline: March 1st

Preference for this award will be given to Native American Women.

The successful applicants will be enrolled with a tribe native, or once native, to the state of Indiana. Priority will be given to members of the Miami, Potawatomi, Shawnee, Wea, Kickapoo, Ottawa, Chippewa, Delaware or Mohican tribes (tribes do not need to be federally recognized), who can verify the enrollment of the applicant. Other members enrolled with any recognized tribes in the United States or Canada are also welcome to apply.

Teach Science – Noyce Scholarship

A, E, I, R2

\$10,200 annually, renewable for up to 2 years, optional \$2,000 summer scholarship each year

Deadlines: March 15th for FALL semester– student must apply to the Secondary Teacher Education Program by February 7th. October 15th for SPRING semester– student must apply to the Secondary Teacher Education Program by September 7th. This scholarship program is funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF). At IUPUI, it is designed to encourage and support outstanding Biology, Chemistry, Physics, and Earth Science students who have a desire to teach middle school and/or high school science. Noyce Scholars will graduate with a B.A. or B.S. degree from the IUPUI School of Science as well as a secondary science teaching certification from the IU School of Education at IUPUI. Eligible students will (1) enroll as a full-time student in the IUPUI School of Science, with an overall GPA of 2.9 / 4.0, (2) have successfully completed at least 60 credit hours, (3) apply to the School of Education Learning to Teach/Teaching to Learn program, and (4) be a citizen or permanent resident on the U.S.

Applicants from under-represented minority groups are encouraged to apply.
