## Undergraduate Study Abroad Scholarships

### IUPUI Scholarships

#### General Scholarships

**IUPUI International Experience Scholarships:** This award is intended to support IUPUI undergraduate students in an approved study abroad program. The award consists of a \$750–3,000 gift, depending on program length. Candidates must be degree seeking at IUPUI and participate in an approved overseas program in which they will earn credit towards an IUPUI degree. See

#### Herron School of Art

**FEHNEL Scholarship:** Up to \$2,500 for full-time Herron students to travel to Pont Aven. Contact Herron Student Services, HR 126, (317) 278-9400. DEADLINE: December 1st for the following summer.

**Rev. Ian FRASER International Travel Scholarship:** Up to \$2,000 awarded to a full time Herron School of Art student to travel with a Herron sponsored international program. #### Kelley School of Business

**Dr. Victor E. CHILDERS International Study Award:** This award is to offset the costs of overseas study. The award consists of \$500. Candidates must be IU Kelley School of Business students studying in Indianapolis and have been admitted to an overseas study program in which they will earn credit towards an IU degree. #### School of Liberal Arts

**Gail & William Plater Scholarship for Civic Engagement:** Up to \$750 will be awarded for the summer or academic year. Recipients may be undergraduate or graduate students in the IU School of Liberal Arts involved in a project or program where students learn through their engagement with the community regardless of the physical location of the activity (i.e., it may be international as well as local). Faculty, who will

DEADLINE: February 1, for the following year.

**Margaret A. COOK Foreign Study Award:** Up to \$2,000 for students in Liberal Arts. Strong preference is given to foreign language majors or students studying in a non-English speaking country at the junior and senior level. Criteria for selection includes: cumulative GPA, language ability, and plans for continued study of a modern foreign language. DEADLINE: February, for the following year.

**BEAUDRY Summer Scholarships for French and Francophone Studies:** One scholarship awarded per year to an IUPUI student participating in a summer study abroad French language and culture program in France or another Francophone country. **Marius J. FAURE Family Scholarship:** This \$1,000 scholarship, is awarded each year to an outstanding student who has declared a major in French language and literature at IUPUI. Not specifically for study abroad, it would nevertheless assist the student in participating in a program abroad. **Max KADE German American Study Abroad Scholarship:** Two \$500 scholarships for studying German in an approved study abroad program. **HISPANOFILA Award:** Limited funds for the study of Spanish through the Department of World

**The School of Liberal Arts Dean's Fellows Scholarships for Overseas Study:** Up to \$2,500 for students in Liberal Arts. This program is aimed at students who have completed at least 24 hours of course work, with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0. Students must plan to attend an overseas study program that offers opportunities for immersion and reflection. Each applicant must complete an application form, give a complete description of the program the student hopes to attend, write an essay addressing how this opportunity will benefit the student's personal and career goals, submit a transcript (unofficial printouts are sufficient) and provide a letter of recommendation from a Liberal Arts faculty member. ## School of Physical Education and Tourism Management

**Efroymsen International Scholarship Program:** Grants for TCEM students of limited financial means to pursue tourism related academic studies abroad. The scholarship will support students who have been traditionally under-represented in study abroad, including but not limited to, students with high financial need and students with diverse ethnic backgrounds. Award recipients will be chosen by a competitive selection process. Students must use the award to defray eligible study abroad costs (i.e. program tuition, room and board, books, local transportation, insurance, and international airfare) Two scholarships of up to \$5,000 will be awarded in an academic year for TCEM students to study abroad.
