IUPUI CONTINUING SCHOLARSHIPS

IUPUI administers over \$200 million in financial aid and scholarships every year to thousands of IUPUI students to aid them in paying for their education. Scholarships, awarded to students through many different programs at IUPUI, are usually awarded based on academic performance and potential for future performance. Some programs also look at leadership, extracurricular involvement and community service. Some also require financial need. See Scholarship Central at www.iupui.edu/~scentral/ for more information on other IUPUI scholarships not listed here.

One Application, One Transcript!

With this application, you may apply for multiple scholarships at the same time and need to submit only one copy of your most recent IUPUI transcript (downloadable from *OneStart*) or, if you are a transfer student, you must provide a transcript from the previous institution where you were registered. In some cases, you can even submit one essay for more than one scholarship. Recommendation forms/letters can also be used for multiple scholarships.

Recommendation forms: Forms must be completed by a faculty member, academic counselor, clergy member or employer, those who can attest to your character and academic performance. **Recommenders cannot be family members.** If preferred a recommendation letter can be submitted. These should be on letterhead and sealed with the recommendation form, then sent to our office.

Note: Be sure recommendations speak to the type of scholarship for which you are applying.

Deadlines: *Deadlines for each scholarship vary.*

NOTE: *Deadlines mean the date the scholarship application and materials must be received in our office, NOT POSTMARKED BY THAT DATE.*

Transfer Students: Scholarships listed in this application in red are available to transfer students. These scholarships are for students who have NOT yet attended IUPUI and plan to do so in the upcoming academic year. If you are a current IUPUI student who previously transferred you are not eligible for transfer scholarships. Please thoroughly read the description under the scholarships identified as transfer scholarships for more detailed information and criteria.

Essays: It goes without saying that essays should observe the general rules of English. It is also recommended that you put your name on each page of the essay. Cover pages, plastic report covers, etc., are not necessary and will be removed when we process them. Because faculty read the essays to understand you better and gauge your abilities, essays are like interviews, so dress accordingly! Originality is encouraged, but observance of grammar rules is even more important.

Scholarships and Tuition at IUPUI

Most scholarships at IUPUI are credited to the student account, usually with the award amount being split between fall and spring semesters. They are applied against the balance on the student account after registration and any remaining balance is sent to the student for use for other educational expenses like books, etc.

Below are the descriptions for the scholarships you may apply for with this application. Be sure to check the Scholarship Central Website for other scholarships at IUPUI and where you can obtain those applications.

Please note the deadlines vary. Deadlines indicate when application materials must be received, NOT postmarked. Applications can be dropped off at the Scholarship Office drop box (CA 103) or UC 2001K. Faxes will only be accepted with prior approval.

Multiple Scholarships: Some combinations of scholarship awards may be possible. IUPUI Enrollment Services tends to limit scholarships and awards to not exceed full-time tuition, fees and books. Some students, however, may receive additional awards from their IUPUI academic units (i.e. School of Science, Liberal Arts, Herron, etc.).

To be eligible for scholarship consideration, you must be fully registered for classes for the upcoming fall semester by June 1st.

This scholarship is available to transfer students with a minimum 3.5 GPA and demonstrable financial aid as defined by the FAFSA.

Motivated adult (30+) students returning to school after a minimum of 5 years, with at least 12 credit hours completed at IUPUI and a 3.3 GPA in all courses since returning who are working toward their first baccalaureate degree.

+McCracken Assist Scholarship

Deadline: May 15th, admission and application

Single, custodial parents at IUPUI pursuing their first undergraduate degree may apply if they have: completed at least 9 credit hours at IUPUI with a minimum 2.75 GPA within the last year (transfer students with 24 credit hours and at least a 3.0 GPA minimum within the last year may also apply). This scholarship is financial need-based, although academic progress/potential are also considered.

Essay Question: As a single parent, what has been the most challenging experience or issue while pursuing your college education and how have you managed to get through it?

Norman Brown Diversity & Leadership Program

Up to \$3000 per academic year

A, E, T, R2

Deadline: March 1, admission and application

The Norman Brown Diversity & Leadership Program is designed to recruit, retain and prepare serious, academically gifted students who have demonstrated a commitment and/or desire to develop leadership skills for today's multicultural world. Program participants are encouraged to attain academic success, engage in leadership and civic activities, and prepare for work force entry. All scholars are required to enroll full time; maintain a 3.0 cumulative GPA; participate in specific program functions; and meet on a regular basis with an assigned IUPUI faculty/staff mentor. Continuing and transfer student applicants must be Indiana residents and have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale. Continuing students are only considered for the fall semester. Preference is given to transfer student/continuing students who have completed 12 credit hours (but no more than 60 up to junior status). **All applicants are required to submit the following items: a) college transcript b) two letters of recommendation, and c) personal essay which must be double spaced, typed, and no longer than THREE typewritten pages. The essay must address ALL of the following questions: 1) Why are you interested in being a Norman Brown Scholar? 2) What qualities do you feel are necessary to be a leader in a multicultural environment and how have you demonstrated these qualities in the past? 3) What challenges or obstacles have you overcome in order to pursue your dreams of going to college? 4) How will you utilize your education and leadership skills to support individuals from underserved communities?** This program is an integral part of IUPUI's efforts to foster the benefits of educational diversity, in part by assuring the obtainment of a critical mass of students from underrepresented minority backgrounds with a history of discrimination. As such, during the application process positive considerations are given to students from underrepresented minority backgrounds and whose presence will enhance the learning environment through increased diversity at IUPUI. Additional consideration is also given to students with significant financial need as defined by the FAFSA. Recipients must maintain fulltime enrollment, a minimum cumulative 3.0 GPA and complete all program requirements.

Deadline: May 15th

Students who graduated from **Washington County High Schools** are eligible to apply. Academic progress/potential required. Must have a FAFSA on file with Financial Aid to be eligible. No essay required.

Jonathan A. Carter Memorial Scholarship

Up to \$500

A, E, T, R1

Deadline: May 15th

This scholarship is designated for part-time returning and/or non-traditional male students who may not otherwise qualify for financial assistance. Students must exhibit qualities of caring for others, desire to succeed and a strong work ethic. Preference will be given to a student majoring in business. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0.

Essay question: (1-page) Describe your personal characteristics that qualify you as the best candidate for this scholarship.

+Robert E. Cavanaugh Scholarship

Up to \$2,000

Deadline: May 15th

Currently enrolled upper-class students of all majors who have graduated from and Indiana High School, who demonstrate leadership abilities and have some demonstrated financial-need are encouraged to apply. Must have at least 26 credits completed at IUPUI and a 3.0 cumulative GPA.

Essay question: In using your leadership abilities, how would you justify the importance and value of a college education to current high school students?

Andrew S. Cebula Scholarship

Up to \$500

Deadline: May 15th

Upper-class or graduate student with demonstrable financial need as determined by the FAFSA. Students may be enrolled full or part-time. Student must have a GPA of at least 3.3.

Essay question: How do you plan on balancing financial obligations and educational obligations?

Thomas C. Cooke/Carol D. Nathan-Passport Academic Excellence Scholarship

A, E, T

Up to \$2,000 annually, renewable

Deadline: May 15th & November 15th, admission and application

Ivy Tech Community College (Indianapolis) associate degree graduates with a 3.3 cumulative GPA and an A.S. or A.A.S. intending to continue toward their bachelor degree at IUPUI are eligible to apply. Applications will be accepted 6 months prior to graduation. A final transcript, with degree noted, must be submitted before the scholarship is awarded. The recipient must be admitted and registered for classes at IUPUI within 2 years after graduating. Students may enroll either full or part-time. Scholarships are renewable annually if the student maintains at least a 3.0 GPA at IUPUI, and must be used within three years of initial award. Students with previous bachelor degrees are ineligible. Students who receive the PTK scholarship will be ineligible to also receive the Passport Scholarship at IUPUI.

Essay Question: Write a one page typed essay on your academic goals and how your experience at Ivy Tech Community College has contributed to achieving these goals.

Commitment to Engineering Excellence Scholarship

\$2,200 per academic year

Deadline: February 1st

This scholarship from the School of Engineering and Technology is for underrepresented students, specifically women and minority students whose presence will enhance the learning environment through increased diversity at IUPUI. Students must either be currently enrolled as Engineering and Technology students and/or be directly admitted to the School of Engineering and Technology (for transfer students). Preference will be given to students with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher. Students must complete the IUPUI scholarship application and an interview. This scholarship is renewable as long full-time enrollment and a cumulative GPA of 3.2 is maintained. Students will also have opportunities for paid undergraduate research.

This is not automatically renewable for continuing students.

Indiana Geology & Gem Society Scholarship

\$1,000

The Indiana Geology & Gem Society Scholarship is available to a sophomore-level geology major who has an overall minimum 3.25 GPA, has completed the introductory physical and historical geology courses with an average GPA of at least 3.7 (A-), and must be enrolled in at least 9 credit hours in the fall semester the award begins, including mineralogy or a higher-level geology course. Students must submit the Continuing Student Scholarship Application, essay, transcript, and letter of recommendation.

Students must submit the Continuing Student Scholarship Application, essay, transcript, and letter of recommendation. Hurston-Evans Scholarship A, E, T, R2, I

Up to \$1,000, renewable for an additional year

Deadline: February 1st

Created in honor of Zora Neale Hurston and Mari Evans, this scholarship seeks to encourage the study of subjects that transcend gender, race, age, culture and economic status and are designed to support students whose creativity, academic achievements and goals reflect the issues articulated in the works of these two prominent American literary figures.

Students seeking a baccalaureate degree in the creative arts, including composing and music performance, liberal arts and social sciences are encouraged to apply. Recipients participate in educational activities each semester. Up to ten \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to continuing IUPUI students.

Two scholarships may be renewed for an additional year with maintenance of a 3.0 GPA, full-time enrollment, and selection as an upper-class mentor. The final round of applicants will be invited to interview with the committee.

Essay Question: (500 words) Write an essay which reflects the issues articulated in the works of these two prominent American literary figures. Explain an obstacle or challenge in your life that you overcame.

Indiana Farm Bureau Insurance Scholarship Program for Bilingual Students (English/Spanish)

\$1,000 A, E, T, I, R2

Deadline: May 15th

Students must be completing a bachelors degree with an interest in pursuing a career in the insurance industry. Scholarships available to junior and senior bilingual (English/Spanish) students enrolled as Business, Spanish or relevant Liberal Arts majors. Students must be a U.S. citizen or legal resident and must be enrolled full-time and maintain a 3.0 GPA. Please note that finalists for this scholarship will be interviewed. The interview will be conducted in both English and Spanish and will follow up on the information provided in the application.

Essay Question: (12 point font, double-spaced, 1-2 pages) Why should an insurance company market its services in the Hispanic community, and how would you represent the company in the Hispanic community?

IUPUI International Experience Scholarship

\$750-\$3,000 A, E, T, F, R1

Deadline: February 1 for summer, fall and academic year programs, October 15th for spring programs

This award is intended to support and encourage IUPUI undergraduate students in an approved study abroad program. The award consists of a \$750-3,000 gift, depending on program length. Candidates with financial need will be given priority.

Consideration. Candidates must be IUPUI students studying in Indianapolis and have been admitted to an overseas study program in which they will earn credit towards an IUPUI degree program. Preference will be given to students with a 2.75 cumulative GPA or above. The deadlines are February 1 for summer, fall and academic year programs and October 15 for spring programs. Sam H. Jones Community Service Scholarship

\$3,500

Deadline: February 1st (priority deadline)

(Two letters of recommendation required, with one from campus representative familiar with your service.)

The Sam H. Jones Community Service Scholarship Program recognizes IUPUI students for previous service to their high school, campus, or community, and supports their continued involvement in educationally meaningful service, leadership, and social advocacy. The program honors Sam H. Jones' legacy as a community leader whose vision and dedication improved the quality of life for many in Central Indiana. Community Service Scholars will volunteer 4 hours per week throughout the academic year at a selected service agency or public school. In addition, Community Service Scholars will enroll in and complete a service-learning course (P330) in the Fall, and work with others to coordinate a campus-wide service event. Applicants must have completed 15 IUPUI credit hours/2.75 GPA by the end of the Spring semester of application and submit two letters of recommendation, with one from a campus representative who is familiar with your service activities.

Essay Question: (2-3 page) Describe the ways that you have been involved in campus or community service activities during the past two years. Discuss the positive impact your service has had on others and the significant lessons that you have learned by participating in voluntary service.

Irving J. Levy Scholarship

A, E, T, F, R2

\$500 up to \$2,500

Deadline: March 15th

During 30 years with IUPUI, Irving J. Levy exemplified his motto of "Students Come First" and showed unwavering dedication to students, particularly adult students. Upon his retirement and in honor of Dr. Levy's dedication to students, the Irving J. Levy Scholarship was established by the Faculty Advisory Committee of the IUPUI General Studies Degree Program. This scholarship is available to an adult General Studies student who exhibits scholastic achievement and demonstrable financial aid need as defined by the FAFSA. The scholarship is intended to cover the cost of tuition and must be used within the academic school year it is given.

Essay Question: (300 words) How would this scholarship enable you to be a successful student?

Sam Masarachia Scholarship

A, E, T, F, R2, I

Full Tuition (In-state rate)

Deadline: February 1st

The Masarachia Program is designed for continuing, full-time students in Liberal Arts interested in studies and careers related to active representation, advocacy and policy research involving labor, senior citizens and communities. Continuing students must have at least a 3.0 GPA and financial need. Only incoming sophomores and juniors with at least two full years to complete prior to graduation are eligible to apply. Transfer students will also be considered.

Essay Question: How do you view the conditions and interests of workers, seniors, and/or communities in today's society? How do you see yourself making a difference in the representation of these groups?

Math and Science Education Scholarship

\$2,500 per year, renewable up to 4 years **A, E, T, R2**

Deadline: March 15th

The Math and Science Teaching Scholarship (MSTS) Program offered by the Urban Center for the Advancement of Math/Science Education (UCASE), is designed to encourage and to support outstanding students who have had a strong math or science based major and who wish to pursue a career in math or science teaching at the middle and/or high school level. Eligible students must be enrolled in a science or math based program and have completed at least 25 credits towards the degree; have a cumulative GPA of 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale); and must be a citizen or permanent resident of the U.S. Eligible students from the under-represented minority groups are encouraged to apply.

Essay question: (500-800 words) What experience(s) has motivated you to pursue a career teaching science or mathematics?

+Charles O. McGaughey Scholarship **A, E, T, R1**

\$2,000

Deadline: May 15th

These leadership awards were established to recognize students who have demonstrated leadership abilities and an appreciation of basic American values through a record of achievement in community services or service to IUPUI. Juniors and Seniors with a 3.5 GPA, with a preference to students in Liberal Arts, Science and Business, are encouraged to apply.

Essay Question: How might social and health issues, urban growth and changes in the environment affect us locally and nationally during this century?

IUPUI Outstanding Transfer Student Scholarship

\$1,000 in-state/\$2,500 out-of-state **A, E, T**

Deadline: May 15th for Fall semester & November 15th for Spring semester, admission and application

Eligible applicants must have a minimum 3.3 GPA with at least 12 transferable credit hours but no more than 60. This scholarship is renewable up to 2 years with the maintenance of full-time enrollment and a 3.0 GPA.

Essay Question: What motivated your decision to choose IUPUI as your new college home?

Phi Theta Kappa (PTK) Scholarship **A, T**

\$1,500 annually, renewable

Deadline: May 15th for Fall & November 15th for Spring, admission and application

This scholarship is available to PTK members who have completed an associate degree at any two-year college. To be eligible, the applicant must have completed, or be within 6 months of completing an A.A., A.S., or A.A.S. degree with at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA upon graduation. Applications will be accepted 6 months prior to graduation. A final transcript, with degree noted, must be submitted before the scholarship is awarded. The recipient must be admitted and registered for classes at IUPUI within 2 years after graduating from any two-year college. This scholarship can be awarded to both full-time and part-time students and must be used within three years of the initial award. The PTK scholarship will be renewable if the student maintains at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA at IUPUI. Students who receive the Passport Academic Excellence Scholarship will be ineligible to also receive the PTK scholarship at IUPUI.

Richard Rapala Scholarships **A, T, F**

Up to \$1,000

Deadline May 15th

For continuing cyto-technology, clinical laboratory science,

medical technology, and nursing majors (**admitted to the program**). Criteria based on academic performance and financial need (FAFSA required). No essay required.

David L. Robbins Scholarship **A, T**

Up to \$500

Deadline May 15th

The David L. Robbins Scholarship, in honor of former Vice Chancellor for Fiscal and Budgetary Affairs at IUPUI, is available to dependents of IUPUI staff or faculty. Applicants must be an upperclassman at IUPUI with a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA and full time enrollment.

Senior Academy Academic Scholarship **A, E, T, R2**

Up to \$2,000.

Deadline: March 1, admission and application

The Senior Academy at IUPUI has established a scholarship program designed to partially support tuition and books for students who are graduating seniors who expect to graduate with a baccalaureate degree at the end of the Spring Semester.

Applications will be reviewed and the awardee selected by the Senior Academy Scholarship Awards Committee. Applicants must (1) be in good academic standing at IUPUI, (2) have successfully completed at least 90 credit-hours, (3) have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.50 on a 4.00 scale, and (4) agree to enroll during the Fall-Spring Semesters for the number of credit-hours required to graduate at the end of the Spring Semester but for no less than a total of at least 20 credit-hours during the last year. The applicant must also submit two letters of recommendation, and complete an essay.

Essay Question: Write a two-page, double-spaced, typewritten essay on your academic goals, how you are achieving them, and your plans after receiving your baccalaureate degree.

Senior Academy Returning-Student Scholarship **A, E, T, R1**

Up to \$3,000

Deadline: March 1st, admission and application

The Senior Academy at IUPUI has established a scholarship program designed to partially support tuition and books for students who, for some reason, dropped out of college-level status for at least 5 years, and are now planning to return to school in order to complete their first undergraduate degree. Applications will be reviewed and the awardee selected by the Senior Academy Scholarship Awards Committee. Applicants must (1) meet regular re-admission requirements to IUPUI, (2) have had a grade point average of at least 2.00 on a 4.00 scale for the college-level courses completed before dropping out, and (3) agree to enroll for at least 6 credit hours per semester. The applicant must also submit one letter of recommendation, and complete an essay.

Essay Question: Write a two-page, double-spaced typewritten essay on your academic goals and why your experience during your absence from school will enhance the successful completion of your academic goals.

Welfare Service League Scholarship **A, T**

\$500

Deadline: May 15th

The Marion County Office of Family and Children awards students who receive services provided by their office. If you currently receive services through the Foster Parent Program or Child Welfare Program you are encouraged to apply. You must be a current IUPUI student pursuing your first undergraduate degree, have a 3.0 GPA and registered for at least 6 credit hours. You also must provide valid proof of your receipt of service, i.e., your EBT card with name, a letter from a caseworker, etc.
